## **CHROMATICS**

definitions to review

**chromatic**----moving up or down by half-steps


<u>accidental</u>---- a musical sign (flat, sharp, natural) that changes the key signature. <u>a musical rule</u>---- once an accidental is placed in a measure it will be in effect for the rest of that measure.

**enharmonic**---a note that has two different names (example--F# and G b)

**sharp** (#) a sign that raises the pitch one half step

**<u>flat</u>** (b) a sign that lowers the pitch one half step
